#### **SCHOOL REMINDERS**

## **CENSUS DAY AND UIFSM - THURSDAY 18th JANUARY 2024**

On Thursday 18th January 2024, it is national School Census Day and, in an effort, to increase the uptake of the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on that day, the menu will be Fish and Chips. There will also be a jacket potato on offer on this day.

Census Day is when the Local Authorities collect information electronically from every school in their area, partly to guide them in planning and funding. They collect details such as pupil numbers, numbers of pupils with Special Educational Needs, entitled to Pupil Premium funding, entitled to Free School Meals, attendance information and so forth. One thing in particular they are looking at this term is the number of children taking the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM), to provide schools with appropriate funding for this service such as utility costs.

To maximise our potential funding, we would encourage all families with children entitled to UIFSM to enjoy their free meal on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January, rather than bringing a packed lunch that day. It is the number of children in Key Stage One eating the free meal on the actual day's lunchtime that informs our funding, rather than meals ordered for that day or children attending school. Pupils who bring a packed lunch from home unfortunately are not able to be included, nor are children who normally take UIFSM, but who are absent on 18<sup>th</sup> January. Once again, we encourage as many as possible to commit to eating the UIFSM on Thursday that week; this will record those children as having eaten on Census Day and therefore count towards the total Government funding that will be allocated to our school for UIFSM for a whole year. We hope that it will also create some enthusiasm amongst the children who don't normally take the meals and lead to more of them eating over the rest of the school year.

#### **YEAR 4 SWIMMING LESSONS**



From Thursday 11th January, our year 4 pupils will be attending swimming lessons at Wave Leisure in Lewes from 9.30 to 10.30am. They will travel to and from the pool by bus and will be back in school in time for lunch

## YEAR 5 WOODLAND WELLBEING

Year 5 children will be having their Woodland Wellbeing sessions on Friday afternoons until half term. Please make sure that they bring in suitable warm waterproof clothes and wellies. We also need a parent helper so please contact the office if you able to help.

#### **MATHS WORKSHOP**

We invite all parents and carers to our 'What is maths mastery?' workshop on

Thursday 18th January at 2:15p.m. Mr Lawler will give a short presentation on what maths mastery is and how your child learns in class. He will also be able to share resources with you and ways to support your child in their maths learning.

The teaching of maths has changed a lot in recent years and the well-researched mastery approach is about deepening understanding of facts and concepts through concrete, visual, pictorial and abstract representations. Please let the school office know if you are able to attend. Thank you.

## **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES**

If we need to close the school due to severe weather etc. then we will first put a message on our website and contact the Local Authority for our school name to be put on their school closures list on their website. We will also email parents and carers as soon as possible and encourage the message to be shared via What App groups.

If the school needs to be closed, for any reason whilst the children are in school, we will email first and then start calling families to cascade the information. It is really important that we have the correct contact details for you so please make sure that any change in email, phone number or address has been received by the school office for our records, thank you.

## **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Breakfast club will continue in term 3 on a **Monday** and **Wednesday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast, compromising of a choice of healthy cereals, toast, fruit, yoghurt or pancakes. Children will participate in an activity until 8:35am when they will join the other children on the playground and be supervised by the teacher on duty.



The sessions are £5 per child per session, which will include breakfast and participation in the activity that day. This can be paid for by BACs or cheque to the school office. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of I session per week. If you would like to book a place in term 3, please contact the school office. Places must be booked in advance and you will then be contacted to confirm your place.

On **Thursdays** Sports Cool Brighton will be offering their morning club. This will be £5 per session which should be made to the school office. This will start at **8am** and does not include breakfast. Sports Cool Brighton will bring a variety of games and activities dependant on group size, ages and weather, such as archery, frisbee, and golf etc. They will also have games like Jenga, connect 4, and dominoes for those who prefer quiet time.
